About the course leader:



Peter Murphy was born 1959 in Leeds.

Educated at Jacob Kramer College of Art and the

University of East London. He trained with iconographer Guillem Ramos Poqui in London. Peter uses traditional techniques from medieval religious painting, including egg tempera paint and gold leaf. is a member of The British Association of Iconographers for whom he runs workshops. He runs international courses, teaching these techniques.

Peter has been commissioned by a number of churches in the UK, notably Tewkesbury Abbey and Hereford Cathedral. He was one of a team on a BBC TV show which recreated a Botticelli painting in a week. He has recently undertaken three major commissions for Hereford Cathedral. He is chief tutor for the St Peter's Centre for Sacred Art, located in the medieval church of St Peter's in the heart of Canterbury and a visiting tutor in Byzantine Iconography, Early Italian painting and gilding techniques for the Edward James Foundation at West Dean College in Sussex.

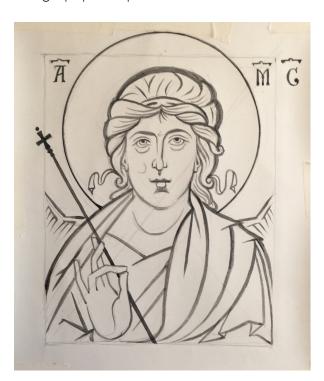

About the Course

This five day retreat will be woven into the prayerful fabric of the Monastery's daily offices. Participants will learn the traditional and ancient techniques of the Byzantine Masters, including water gilding, with 24 carat gold leaf over clay and how to make and use pigments made fresh each day in the studio from natural mineral colours and eggs.

The aim of the workshop is to produce a small head and shoulders icon in the late Byzantine 'Proplasmos' style. Peter will give guidance along the way and no previous experience of Iconography is required.
