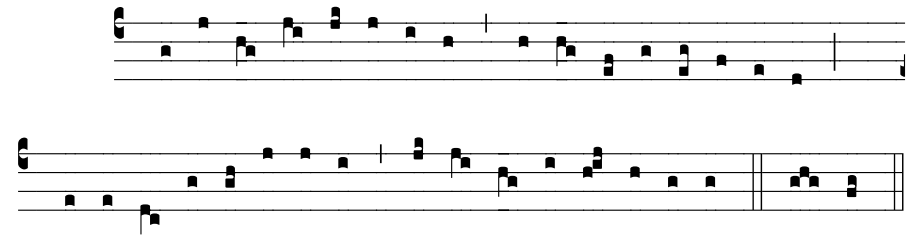

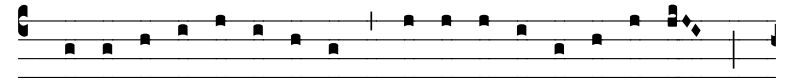
- 1 The Lamb's high banquet called to share,

May share your Paschal victory.

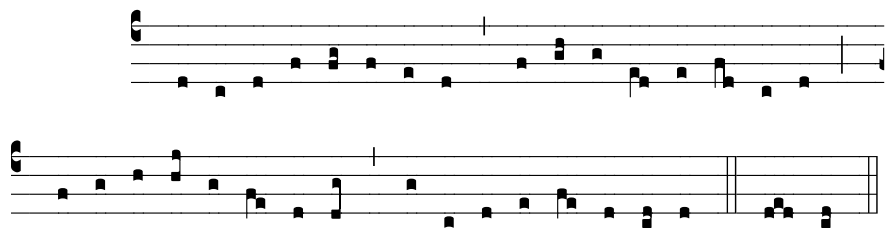
8 All praise to you, O risen Lord,

be equal praise eternally. Amen.

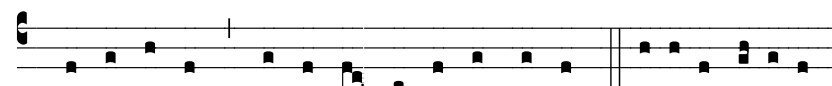

THE GOSPEL CANTICLES

Benedictus
