

MATTINS on weekdays


Invitatory Christ the Lord was tempted and suffered for us; come, let us adore him.


- 2 Give guidance to our wandering ways, forgive us, Lord, our frequent sin; restore us by your loving care to love and joy and peace within.

- 5 The universe your glory shows, all-glorious Father, Spirit, Son; we shall acclaim your majesty, eternal Trinity in One.



THE GOSPEL CANTICLES

Benedictus

- Blessed be the Lord, **the** Gód of Ísrael; * he has come to his péople and sét them free.
- He has raised up for us **a** míghty Sáviour, * born of the house of <u>his</u> sérvant Dávid.
- Through his holy prophets he promised ôf old, † that he would save **us** fróm our énemies, * from the hands <u>of</u> áll who háte us.
- He promised to show mer**cy** tó our fáthers * and to remember <u>his</u> hóly cóvenant.
- This was the oath he swore to **our** fáther Ábraham, * to set us free from the hánds <u>of</u> our énemies,
- free to wor**ship** hím without fear, * holy and righteous in his sight all <u>the</u> dáys of our life.
- You, my child, shall be called the pro**phet** of the Most High, * for you will go before the Lord <u>to</u> prepare his way,
- to give his people know**ledge** of salvátion * by the <u>forg</u>íveness of their sins.
- In the tender **com**pássion óf our God * the dawn from on high shall bréak upón us,
- to shine on those who dwell in darkness and **the** shadow of death, * and to guide our feet <u>in</u>to the way of peace.
